#### DO NOT GRIEVE THE HOLY SPIRIT OF GOD

### **Ephesians 4:30-32**

## 1/Do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God (30)

- \* Note the context—how we communicate with each other (25-32)
- \* Deceit, anger, corrupt talk, bitterness etc grieve the Holy Spirit
- \* <u>Grieve</u> = pain, injure, make sorrowful, cause to weep
- \* Why is the Holy Spirit grieved when we sin?
- \* He is a person (not just a force).
  - -- Only a person can be grieved
  - -- Grammatically, the definite article ('the') indicates His person-hood
- \* He is holy
  - -- Therefore offended by sin
- \* He is the Holy Spirit of God
  - -- Therefore to be obeyed

# 2/By whom you were sealed for the day of redemption (30)

- \* After we believe, we are sealed by the Holy Spirit (1:13)
- \* A seal is a guarantee
- \* When the Spirit comes upon us He guarantees our redemption

## 3/Let all... be put away (31)

- \* All bitterness
- \* All wrath
- \* All anger
- \* All clamour
- \* All slander
- \* All malice

### 4/Put away... (31)

- \* Put away = pick up and carry away; take away; make a clean sweep
- \* It is an imperative (ie a command)
- \* The Greek Aorist tense is used which indicates once for all
- \* All = all!

#### 5/ALL bitterness (31)

- \* Bitterness is toxic—like a spreading cancer
- \* It causes trouble
- \* It defiles people
- \* We dare not nurture it!
- \* See Deut 29:16-28; Hebrews 12:15

## 6/ALL wrath (31)

- \* Wrath = strong anger; a rush or flare-up of anger; strong passion
- \* We tend to justify it
- \* Self-mastery = a fruit of the Spirit
- \* Wrath and self-mastery do not co-exist!
- \* Read Proverbs 14:17; 16:32

## 7/ALL anger

- \* Anger = prolonged, seething, cultivated anger
- \* Inconsistent with the fruit of the Spirit
- \* Grieves the Holy Spirit
- \* See Proverbs 19:11; Col 3:8
- \* Note: There are occasions when anger is justifiable—see Mark 3:5.

#### 8/ALL clamour (31)

- \* Clamour = outcry, shouting, brawling (NIV).
- \* No place for this among God's people
- \* Today's noisy world affects us negatively
- \* Eg effect of recorded music at shopping centres, railway stations: less vandalism with light classical music.
- \* Eg Mennonite attitude: tranquillity and peace characterises their homes

### 9/ALL slander (31)

- \* Slander (blasphemia) = speaking evil of another person; calumny; defamation
- \* Many proverbs denounce this—
- \* Proverbs 10:18-21; 11:9, 12, 13; 12:18; 13:3; 15:4; 16:13, 28; 18:8, 21; 21:23; 25:11; 30:10.
- \* See Eph 4:29.

#### 10/ALL slander (31)

- \* Tongues = usual initial sign of the Spirit coming upon us
- \* Symbolic of the Spirit taking control of our most difficult member (James 3)
- \* But—if our speech does not <u>continually</u> glorify God and help others, we (not the gift) are just noisy gongs and clanging cymbals (1 Cor 13:1)

#### **11/ALL** malice (**31**)

- \* Malice = badness; malignity; evil; trouble
- \* Holiness is God's will for us
- \* We do not want to grieve the Holy Spirit
- \* Sin is never acceptable; there is never any excuse for it

#### 12/Be kind to one another (32)

- \* Kind (*chrestos*) = benevolent; good; gracious; agreeable; benign
- \* Mellow (Luke 5:39)
- \* An early Latin writer said Christians followed Iesus Chrestos (instead of *Christos* = anointed One). But he was not too far wrong.
- \* Certainly, God has been kind to us! (Eph 2:7; Titus 3:4)

#### 13/Be tender hearted (32)

- \* Tender hearted = having good viscera!
- \* It means deeply-felt love
- \* Love that touches and moves us
- \* The Holy Spirit helps us to feel the needs of others

## 14/Forgiving one another as God in Christ forgave you (32)

- \* Forgive (*charidzomai*) = act graciously and generously
- \* From *charis* (grace)
- \* We are to forgive as God in Christ forgave us.
- \* Note: Cannot expect to be forgiven if we are not kind and tender-hearted ourselves
- \* How did God forgive us? (Think about the details.) So should we forgive!
- \* Eg the Lord's prayer: 'Forgive us... as we forgive...'

## Do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God (30)

- \* When we use our speech for evil, we grieve and sadden the Holy Spirit
- \* To be filled with the Spirit means not just to speak in tongues but also to speak in love!

### Our response

- \* How shall we respond?
- \* Is there someone we should see?
- \* Is there a matter to be put right?
- \* Is there an apology to make?
- \* Is there an action we should forgive?
- \* Let's pray about these matters right now...

#### SOMETHING TO THINK ABOUT

### Read Ephesians 4:30-32

- 1. Think about your own life over the last week. How often have you said things and done things that would grieve the Holy Spirit?
- 2. Think about one of these: what could you have done differently?
- 3. We already have redemption (Ephesians 1:7), yet there is a day of redemption coming (30). How do we explain this? Compare 1 Peter 1:5.
- 4. Can you think of cases in your experience where bitterness has done more harm to the bitter person than to anyone else? (If you are in a group, try to avoid using names or anything else that might identify the person concerned.) What could the person concerned have done differently?
- 5. Consider the six sins Paul lists in verse 31. Why do you think these things grieve the Holy Spirit? Consider them one by one.
- 6. Paul says we should put <u>all</u> of these far away from us. Is he being intolerant? Is there sometimes some excuse for what we do? Why or why not?

- 7. Consider the fruit of the spirit (Galatians 5:22, 23). Which of these is in direct contrast with each of the six sins in verse 31?
- 8. What does it mean to be kind? (32)
- 9. What does it mean to be tenderhearted (ESV) or compassionate (NIV)? (32)
- 10. Why is God's forgiveness only through Christ? (Romans 5 might help here.)
- 11. How did God forgive us? (32) Think of as many aspects as you can.

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
